



What we know: This is a scanned negative from a collection donated by the Temple family, who were pioneers in Oconto Falls, Wisconsin. The house is a Sears Home, built in the 1920s and located on the Temple family farm. The photograph is from a group likely taken shortly after WWI by William Temple, who was an amateur photographer.

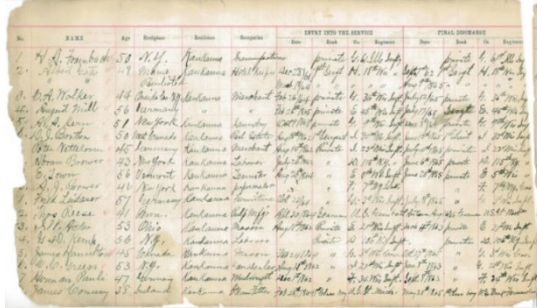

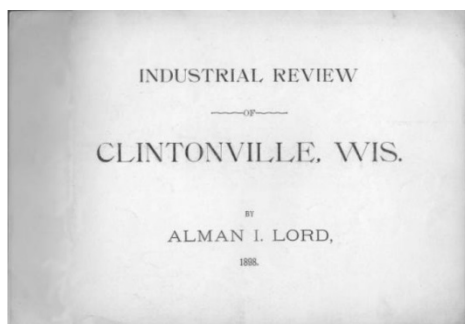
